From the Diary of Sister Faustina Kawalska, paragraph #699

“My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though it sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy.”

Sister Maria Faustina Kowalska was born in 1905 and at the age of 20 she entered the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. On May 1, 1933 she made her perpetual vows. Shortly after her final vows she was diagnosed with tuberculosis. Sister Faustina lived with this debilitating disease for five years before it took her life in October of 1938. Her cause for Canonization was initiated in 1965 by then Archbishop of Krakow Poland, Karol Wojtyla, who was later elected Pope John Paul II. She was beatified on April 18, 1993 and Canonized by Pope John Paul II on April 30, 2000.

As the preface to her book states, “Sister Faustina was graced by a special communion with God and her diary expresses the conviction that this communion ought to be the center of our lives. On February of 1931 she describes a vision of the Lord Jesus clothed in a white garment. One hand was raised in the gesture of blessing; the other was touching his garment at the breast. From beneath the garment, slightly drawn aside at the breast, there were emanating two large rays, one red, the other pale.” Jesus said to her, ***“Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: ‘Jesus, I trust in You’. I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and then throughout the world.”*** Since the 1940’s the Marians of the Immaculate Conception have shared this conviction and have undertaken the promotion of God’s Mercy throughout the world, particularly as Sister Faustina has proclaimed it.

Jesus says in paragraph #48, ***“I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I Myself will defend it as My own glory.”*** And in paragraph #723 Jesus says, ***“The graces I grant you are not for you alone, but for a great number of other souls as well... I perform works of mercy in every soul. The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to My mercy. My mercy is confirmed in every work of My hands. He who trusts in My mercy will not perish, for all his affairs are Mine...”***
